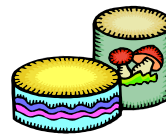
Hurricane Katrina Relief Efforts

A back-to-school open house will be held for the entire school on Wednesday, September 21 from 6:30 – 7:30 PM. Parents and students should attend.

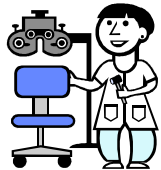
First Mid-Quarter is Upon Us

Lions Sight Van to be at MdC

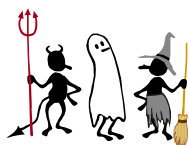
On Thursday, September 22, beginning at 12:45 PM, the Lions Club will have its sight van on
