Hurricane Katrina Relief Efforts



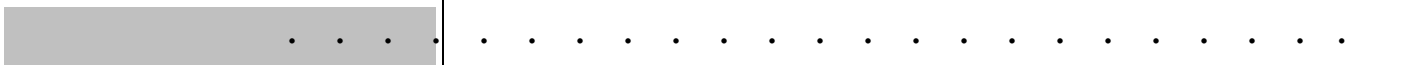

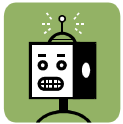
